In August of 1858, President James Buchanan while he was staying at his summer White House, received and sent a Transatlantic Telegraph Message between Queen Victoria at Buckingham Palace and Bedford Springs. BCARS commemorated the event with **N3B**, a Special Event Station set up at the Omni Bedford Springs Resort.



BCARS Club members operated SSB stations from all over the county. On Tuesday, 16 August a special CW station, manned by W3DRW and K3QNT operated directly from the resort.
